The Jeff Cherubin Domond School's first graduation was celebrated in the mountains above Marbial, Haiti, and 2,500 miles away in Claremont, California. On June 15, 21 children from the Domond School; their families; the school staff; Joe Domond, Executive Director of the Jeff Cherubin Domond Foundation; and other members of the Domond family participated in the graduation marking the children's completion of their preschool education. A few days earlier on June 12th, 40 supporters and donors to the school and the Foundation's work gathered poolside at the Jim and Marita Stoneman's home in Claremont to celebrate the Foundation's work.

The group celebrated with tasting of select local and California wines and hors d'oeuvres. The supporters experienced an enjoyable evening with a blind wine tasting contest, challenging both those who considered themselves "drinkers only" as well as the "connoisseurs" in the crowd. A raffle gave an additional opportunity to support Eight winners were awarded the Foundation. attractive baskets, many following the wine tasting theme, but others included Haitian jewelry and a selection of fair trade items from around the world. The blind wine tasting contest identified some of the connoisseurs, including Mark Tundis who was the most successful in identifying the variety, vineyard location and cost of the reds and whites varieties presented to the contestants.
